

















A grand ceremony took place in the Federal Republic of Nigeria on April 15, 1995 to acclaim President Kim Il Sung as the Chieftain of the Sun.

At the ceremony king of Umuozzi Community said, "It is the greatest glory for us to award His Excellency President Kim Il Sung the title of Chieftain of the Sun for the first time in Nigeria.
